Instructions:

1. Imagine you are riding in an elevator with someone who wants to know why 4-H is important to you, and you have 1-2 minutes to describe how you're involved and why.
2. Describe:

<p>1. What is 4-H?</p> <p>4-H is a Youth Development Program that started in 1902.</p>
<p>2. How long have you been involved?</p> <p>I've been a member of the (XXXX) 4-H Club for (XX) years.</p>
<p>3. Why do you do it?</p> <p>My favorite thing about being in 4-H is... The thing I love most about it is... (having fun with my friends, taking things to the fair, doing community service projects...)</p>
<p>4. What are you doing now?</p> <p>Right now I'm working on... (Getting my entries ready for the fair, learning how to upcycle clothing, Showing my chicken...)</p>
<p>5. What comes next?</p> <p>In the future I hope to... (Be an officer in our club, take a trip to Washington DC, earn a showmanship award, work in the potato stand, learn how to use a jigsaw...)</p>
<p>6. How do I learn more?</p> <p>There are clubs all over the county (or country). You can find one close to you by logging into the Dane County 4-H Web Site (or 4-H Online Web Site).</p>

3. Using this outline, create a message that will clearly explain how and why you are involved in 4-H.
4. This is typically used to create a “common” message that every member of a project team is able and comfortable to share. It can be used on any scale – from creating a common message from a group (your club, your leaders, a project group) to an individual creating their personal message.
