



Speakers

Dr. Gary Sands is a professor in the Department of Bioproducts and Biosystems Engineering at the University of Minnesota. For the past 18 years, Dr. Sands has developed and delivered Extension programming/education related to the design, management, and mitigation of unwanted effects associated with artificial drainage systems, in the northern corn-belt. Dr. Sands is creator and host of the Extension website, www.DrainageOutlet.umn.edu.

Paul Kent is an attorney and partner with Stafford Rosenbaum LLP and the author of Wisconsin Water Law in the 21st Century. His practice focuses on environmental regulatory matters with a particular emphasis on water issues.
