

Hay Market Demand and Price Report for the Upper Midwest As of October 10, 2016

All hay prices quoted are dollars per ton FOB point of origin for alfalfa hay unless otherwise noted.

The information presented in this report is compiled from public and private sales and reports in the Midwest.

The past several months of hay reports are archived. To view previous hay reports, go to the Team Forage web site and click on the past hay reports section.

Hay auction data will be collected on the first and third week of the month and posted on the following Monday when possible. Prices quoted in this report are for "as fed" alfalfa hay.

Demand and Sales Activity

There was strength in the market for prime and grade #1 small square bale alfalfa. Lower quality hay continues to be discounted.

For Nebraska, demand and movement of hay is light. Most buyers are buying on an as needed basis. Demand for hay should increase going through October as producers wean spring calves and move them off pasture and supplement feed calves. For Iowa, limited hay sales this week as buyers continue to look for bargains. The nightmare 2016 growing season is coming to an end. It was a tough year to make dry hay. With over 40 inches of rain and high humidity during the growing season, how would you make quality dry hay?

In South Dakota, light hay sales with slow market activity and steady prices with very light interest and demand for alfalfa hay. Rain and some light snow flurries this week slowed field work. *In Illinois*, demand is light with slow market activity for heavy supplies. Higher quality hay has sold at steady prices while lower hay is discounted. Demand for hay should improve as pasture yields decline and cattlemen wean calves.

For Missouri, hay movement is very slow. Supply is moderate with a light demand and steady to weak prices. Hay listings continue to increase and hay feeding season is slowly approaching.

In Southwest Minnesota, a good supply of lower quality hay, with light demand and lower prices. Quality alfalfa hay is just not available at the auction.

In Wisconsin, prime and grade #1 hay was available and produced good prices. Lower quality hay is readily available, has very little demand and a reduced price.

Overall straw price was steady to stronger this week. Small square bale straw averaged \$3.25 a bale this week (range of \$1.00 to \$6.00). Large square bales increased \$5.00/bale and averaged \$38.00 per bale (range of \$18.00 to \$55.00). Large round bales decreased \$5.00/bale and averaged \$33.00 per bale (range of \$23.00 to \$39.00).
