Join us in an upcoming Master Naturalist course!

Upham Woods is partnering with the WI Master Naturalist Program to offer a new opportunity for volunteers! The WI Master Naturalist Program is a statewide effort to promote awareness, understanding, and stewardship of the state's natural resources. Its goal is to develop a corps of informed volunteers dedicated to education and service within their Wisconsin communities. Course participants receive 40 hours of training in natural history, interpretation, and conservation stewardship. Classes combine classroom instruction with field experiences along with a capstone project. Capstone projects are completed in small groups and involve up to 3 hours of out of class time. Once trained, a WI Master Naturalist provides volunteer service in one of three areas: education/interpretation, stewardship, or citizen science. To maintain certification, a volunteer must complete 40 hours of service each year and 8 hours of advanced training.

This course will also feature introduction and use of [Digital Observation Technology Skills Kits \(DOTS\)](#) as a framework for our field studies during the course. The DOTS program is an outdoor environmental education mobile technology kit to connect learners to the outdoors in new and innovative ways.
